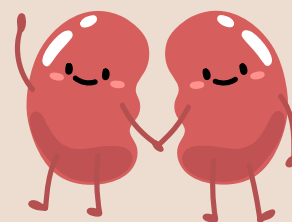


CKD Newsletter

Webpage

- **48%** of respondents have accessed the webpage.
- 81% of those found it 'extremely useful', 19% 'somewhat useful'.
- Guidelines were most frequently cited for being most useful, followed by patient resources and tools and guides.

How's it going?

Thank you to all those who took the time to respond to the questionnaire. Please see the results and follow up actions as a result of these.

Response Rate

- Grand Union- 40 responses & MWEB- 10 responses

Training

- **96%** had training; many had attended multiple sessions
- 77% found the training 'extremely useful' and 19% found it 'somewhat useful'.
- Management to delay CKD progression cited as most useful, closely followed by evidence to support management options.

We will ensure any future training is targeted at the most useful aspects.

MDTs

- **67%** had attended a MDT
- 77% of those found them 'extremely useful' & 18% 'somewhat useful'.

Biochemistry changes to urine collection

As some practices are now using Monovette syringes rather than white topped bottles for urine collection, we have updated the posters to show a monovette syringe instead of a white topped bottle.

Visualisation

- **73%** of respondents have installed the visualisation on their toolbar.
- Of those who installed the visualisation:
 - 43% use it regularly, 43% use it occasionally.
 - 55% find it extremely useful, 45% somewhat useful
 - The most useful part was the diagnosis and KFRE followed by exception codes and reducing CKD progression.
